

## Homework Advice

1. Make sure your child has a clean, orderly place to do homework. Provide adequate lighting, a solid writing surface, and a suitable chair.



2. Reduce anything that might distract your child, such as television, radio, computer noises, and other children.

3. When helping, guide your child to the correct answers, using words your child can understand and use.

4. If the child is struggling or truly frustrated, it is okay to submit an incorrect assignment. It will show me where the student needs more instruction. Also, during class, I review homework assignments, provide specific feedback to correct errors. Students correct their work during review.

5. Provide a snack before or during homework studies, or schedule homework after dinner.



6. Ask your child every day about homework. Review the assignment book with your child to ensure all homework is done on time. Plan long-term assignments with your child to avoid a “crunch”.



7. Write notes to me in the assignment book or on a slip of paper, or email me if you have any concerns about your child’s ability to complete homework assignments.
